14,000 bottles have become Creative Commons. As part of an artwork on the ground of an industry hall, they have been filled at a public fountain in Dornbirn Hatlerdorf, Austria. The source is spending premium quality water, and everybody who passes by can taste it. It is managed by a co-op, founded by local farmers.

Open Source Water is being offered at the Creative Commons Austria launch event at the Ars Electronica Festival 2004. A local consortium has supported the translation of the international cc license into national jurisdiction.
